

**Proceedings of the Preparedness Meeting for Impending Monsoon under the Chairmanship of Chief Secretary on 14.06.2016 at 11:00 AM in Ellerslie Committee room.**

At the outset, Shri D.D.Sharma, Special Secretary (Rev-DM) welcomed Shri V.C. Pharka, Chief Secretary, Shri Tarun Shridhar, Additional Chief Secretary (Rev-DM), Shri Shrikant Baldi, Additional Chief Secretary (Finance & Planning) and other senior officers of the State Government. Following decisions were taken in view of the Impending Monsoon in the State:-

- Hazard, Risk and Vulnerability Study should be implemented in each district of the State for identification of the most vulnerable areas and effective preventive steps taken in advance to minimize the impact of any disaster.  
**(Action by – All the Deputy Commissioners)**
- In every district a Mapping of all Water resources be carried out.  
**(Action by – IPH Department)**
- All the DCs must ensure the evacuation of establishments/labor colonies/Settlements along with the river bed in low lying areas.  
**(Action by – All the Deputy Commissioners)**
- Culverts along the roads get blocked invariably due to debris/encroachments. As a result, water pools are created on the roads resulting in damage to the roads and causing inconvenience to public at large. PWD should survey all culverts along the National and State Highways and open them immediately so that the water finds its natural passage.  
**(Action by – PWD)**
- All Hydel Power Project authorities should ensure that without sufficient prior warning, water is not released from Dams. They should ensure proper dissemination of warning/alerts before releasing the water .  
**(Action by – MPP & Power Department)**
- All the weather related warning/advisories should be publicized in Print & Electronic Media for wider dissemination to general public.  
**(Action by – Department of Public Relation, AIR, Doordarshan & Private FM Channels)**
