PROCEEDINGS OF THE 10<sup>TH</sup>MEETING OF THE STATE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE (SEC) CONSTITUTED UNDER THE DISASTER MANAGEMENT ACT, 2005 HELD ON 25<sup>th</sup> MARCH 2020 UNDER THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF SH. ANIL KHACHI THE CHIEF SECRETARY – CUM - SEC, HIMACHAL PRADESH.

At the outset, the Principal Secretary (Rev-DM), Sh. Onkar Chand Sharma welcomed the Chief Secretary and other members of the SEC and briefed them about the provisions of the DM Act 2005, and powers and functions for the SEC. Thereafter agenda item were taken up for discussion.

#### AGENDA ITEM NO.10.1: ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES (SECTION 22) AND POWER & FUNCTIONS OF THE SEC IN THREATENING DISASTER SITUATION (SECTION 24) & COVID-19 VIRUS OUTBREAK

2. The SEC was made aware of the functions of the State Executive Committee as per the provision of Section 22 and Section 24 of the Disaster Management Act 2005 which defines the powers and functions of State Executive Committee in the event of threatening disaster situation. It was also brought to the notice of the SEC that State Government has been empowered to take measure for disaster management under Section 38. In case of threatening disaster situation, the Act provides for the resources of different departments of the Government of the State to be made available to the State Executive Committee or the District Authorities, as the case may be, for the purposes of effective response, rescue and relief in any threatening disaster situation or disaster. It was also informed that the DM Act also lays down responsibilities on the Departments of State Government in threatening disaster situation under Section 39 Sub-Section (d) which describes the responsibilities of

departments of the State Government. As per this provisions, it shall be the responsibility of every department of the Government of a State to respond effectively and promptly to any threatening disaster situation or disaster in accordance with the State Plan, and in accordance with the guidelines or directions of the National Executive Committee and the State Executive Committee.

#### COVID-19 Outbreak:

3. The SEC was apprised about the status of the measures taken in the State regarding containment of the COVID-19 outbreak by the Disaster Management setup. In addition to this, in order to deal with the challenge of disaster, directions of National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) and National Executive Committee (NEC) dated 24.03.2020 were also shared with the SEC. NDMA & NEC has issued these directions/guidelines under the Disaster Management Act 2005 directing Ministries/Departments of Govt. of India, State/Union Territory Governments and State/Union Territory Authorities to take measures to deal with the COVID-19 threat. These orders shall remain in force in entire part of the country for a period of 21 days with effect from 25.3.2020.

4. Further, the Act provides for waving of procurement process in disaster situation by the NDMA, SDMA and DDMAs under Section 50 of the Act.

5. The SEC was also informed that SDMA has notified Emergency Support Functions (ESFs) in the year 2011 detailing roles and responsibilities of Departments/Organizations of the State Govt. for coordinated, effective and timely response in disasters/threatening disaster situations. It was suggested that in order to deal with the COVID-19 threat additional ESFs may be approved for coordinated and effective response.

SEC was also informed the SEC that DM Cell is also preparing a COVID-19 Management Strategy & Action Plan for Himachal Pradesh.

#### Decisions:

a) The SEC approved to reiterate the Emergency Support Functions (ESF) notified in 2011 by HPSDMA defining roles and responsibilities of the different State agencies to all Departments/Organisations.

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- b) In the event of current threatening pandemic situation, the SEC approved notification of the supplementary ESFs as per Annexure C of the Agenda to take effective measures to prevent the spread of COVID-19 in the State.
- c) The ESFs may be shared with all the stakeholders by Order of the Chairman.
- d) The Guidelines issued vide order No. 40-3/2020-DM-I (A) dated 24.03.2020 and subsequent addendums by the NDMA & National Executive Committee be circulated to all concerned in the State for effective implementations in letter and spirit.
- e) The SEC directed that the COVID-19 Management Strategy may be prepared at the earliest.
- f) The Department of IT may prepare Mobile Application for capturing data from field w.r.t COVID-19 at the earliest.
- g) The State Emergency Operation Center (SEOC) and District Emergency Operations Centre(s) (DEOCs) to be operationalized as information nerve center for coordination and compilation of information and reports for COVID-19.

The meeting ended with vote of thanks to and from the Chair.

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Annexure - I

#### HP STATE DISASTER MANAGEMENT AUTHORITY

#### **Emergency Support Functions (ESFs) Plan**

In the aftermath of a major natural disaster wherein State Government's assistance is required for the districts, the command, control and coordination will be carried out under the ESFs Plan.

<u>EOC shall</u> activate the ESFs and the concerned Department/Agency of each ESFs shall identify requirements in consultation with their counterparts in affected districts, mobilize and deploy resources to the affected areas to assist the district (s) in its/their response action. The State EOC shall maintain a close link with the District EOCs and NEOC.

#### ESFs shall be responsible for the following:

- 1. They will coordinate directly with their functional counterpart in districts to provide the state government assistance required. Request for assistance will be channeled from the district both through the Deputy Commissioner and designated departments/ agencies. Based on the identified requirements by the districts, appropriate assistance shall be provided by an ESF Department/ Agency to the district or at the Deputy Commissioner's request, directly to an affected area.
- 2. The designated authorities for each of ESF shall constitute quick response teams and assign the specific task to each of the member.
- 3. The designated authorities for each of the ESF shall identify and earmark the resources i.e. Manpower and materials to be mobilized during the crisis.

- 4. An inventory of all the resources with details shall be maintained by each of the designated authority for each of the ESF.
- 5. The designated authority for each of the ESF will also enter into pre-contracts for supply of resources, both goods and services to meet the emergency requirements.
- 6. The designated authority for each of the ESF will be delegated with adequate administrative, legal and financial powers for undertaking the tasks assigned to them.

#### Primary and Secondary Agencies

The designated primary agency, acting as the State agency shall be assisted by one or more support agencies (secondary agencies) and shall be responsible for managing the activities of the ESF and assisting the district in the rescue and relief activities and ensuring that the mission is accomplished. The primary and secondary agencies have the authority to execute response operations to directly support the needs of the affected districts.
